UNITED FOR LIFE





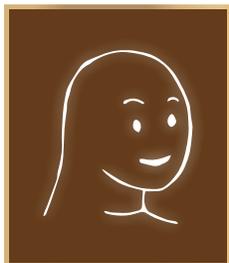
By Yourself

With Your Wife

Request the booklet *God's Idea of Marriage* from NYM Ministries www.nym.ca. Read through it with your wife and discuss it together.

The Bible says three times that a man will “be joined to his wife”. What does this mean?

To make furniture, you can fasten different kinds of wood together with glue. You spread the glue on both pieces of wood, then press them tightly together. When the glue dries, the pieces of wood cannot be separated without doing great damage to them.

That is how God wants a marriage to be—husband and wife so close together that nothing can separate them. The way to have a marriage like this is found in one word, commitment.

COMMITMENT IS:

- A solemn promise made before God and human witnesses
- Daily prayer for your wife
- An agreement with your eyes not to look with desire at another woman
- A gift, a hug, an “I love you” at least once a day
- Helping her with her work even when you are tired
- Finding times to laugh and play together
- Spending extra time together during sickness or suffering
- Heart-to-heart talks late at night when you would like to sleep
- Calling home at least once a day when you must be away

COMMITMENT IS NOT:

- A “trial marriage” that can be stopped if it doesn’t work out
- Believing in divorce as a way out of marriage problems
- Putting work, sports, children, or other women ahead of your wife
- An agreement where you can both flirt with someone else occasionally
- A 50-50 relationship, where each comes only half-way to agree with the other.

A husband and wife who are truly committed to each other will be united for life in body, mind, heart and spirit.
